As principal I have had the responsibility and privilege of helping lead a school with over 850 students and over 80 staff members to ever-higher levels of achievement. During my tenure as principal at O.A. Thorp Academy:

- Our composite NWEA scores in Reading and Math have risen each year, and we consistently perform in the top 5-10% of elementary schools nation-wide in Reading and Math.
- I have helped monitor and evaluate classroom teachers, auxiliary staff and educational support personnel providing an environment that acknowledges their instructional strengths, lauds their achievements, and supports their personal development.
- I have managed the implementation of a social-emotional learning program freeing our counselor from case-management duties allowing her to work with students full-time both in small groups as well as through individual consultation.
- Through innovative scheduling practices and by helping provide a continuum of services for our "diverse-needs learners" I have supported the efforts of our special education team in establishing O.A. Thorp as an exemplary model of student inclusion for schools throughout the city and the state.
- At O.A. Thorp Academy, I have developed learning cohorts allowing our school to have one of the highest number of dual endorsed (ESL/LBS1) general education teachers in the city.
- I have helped provide our families with diverse learners a number of resources in mental health, social-emotional development and academic extension through partnerships with the state of Illinois, Loyola University, The University of Chicago, Lutheran Social Services and other agencies.

As the computer teacher for Jamieson Elementary I have designed and implemented the technology curriculum and have actively taught students in all grades from K to 8th. Currently, my teaching focus is on students in grades 6 to 8 where students are challenged to master office applications such as Word, Excel and PowerPoint. Additionally, elective computer classes allow students to learn the skills of digital imaging and graphic manipulation, as well as advanced presentation techniques using PowerPoint, and an introduction to film making and video editing through MS Moviemaker.

Classroom Teacher 7th & 8th Grade Language Arts/Social Studies, Duprey Elementary School 1993-1995

During my first teaching job I learned how to prepare effective lessons with clear objectives and high expectations of my students. I also learned the importance of building a strong, structured community in the classroom to counter the lack of structure many of my students faced by upbringings filled with gangs, high-crime and low parental involvement in education.
